MARRIED TO COMICS

A rare glimpse into the life and art of two giants of autobiographical comics, who are also married. Laying their personal lives to bare in their work, including the intimate details of their troubled marriage, Justin Green and Carol Tyler pioneered and set the bar for the deeply personal genre.

In 1972, during the height of the Underground Comix movement in San Francisco, Justin changed the course of the medium with his magnum opus, Binky Brown Meets the Holy Virgin Mary, about growing up Catholic with OCD. It was one of the earliest examples of an autobiographical comic and immediately influenced Art Spiegelman and Robert Crumb to create their own work, inspiring thousands more. After reading Binky, Carol was drawn to San Francisco and to Justin, sparking a romance and marriage.

For years Carol worked to distinguish herself and to get out of her husband's shadow, but when their marriage is put to the ultimate test, they separate and Carol forges a path to her own comic masterpiece, Soldier's Heart. Can the marriage survive their troubled past? Married to Comics is a riveting documentary that is a testament to the power of art and the resilience of love. 2023, U.S., DCP, 115 minutes. All Illusions Must Be Broken is a cinematic contemporizing of the work of American cultural anthropologist Ernest Becker whose book The Denial of Death won the Pulitzer Prize for non-fiction in 1974. Becker's multidisciplinary exploration of human nature and his own personal testimony challenge us to move beyond our fears and see the beauty that surrounds our fragile lives.

This is the third documentary feature Dunn and Sewell have made in a series produced by Owsley Brown, along with executive producers Terrence Malick and Robert Redford. It premiered at the Palm Springs International Film Festival. 2024, U.S., DCP, 89 minutes. Recommended for 16+.

AMERICAN CONSPIRACY: THE OCTOPUS MURDERS

An investigative journalist pursuing a political conspiracy known as "The Octopus" is found dead in his hotel room. Decades later, new details emerge.

From the Emmy-winning team behind Wild Wild Country, this docuseries reexamines a twisted government conspiracy theory. Photojournalist Christian Hansen continues the work of Danny Casolaro, a reporter who mysteriously died while investigating a major political conspiracy linking spy software theft, unsolved murders and major 20th-century scandals. This documentary miniseries premiered on Netflix. 2024, U.S., DCP, 49 minutes. Recommended for 17+.

Comedian, disruptor-extraordinaire Lizz Winstead (co-creator *The Daily Show*) and her team of activists crisscross the U.S. to support abortion clinic staff and bust stigma. Pop culture icons and next-gen comics fuel this six-year road film activating small-town folks to rebuild vandalized clinics, exposing wrongdoer politicians, domestic terrorists, and media neglect as the race to the bottom ensues. A bold call to action reminds us that when the patriarchy burns down, joy will prevail.

Their tour includes a stop in Louisville. This film had its world premiere at DOCNYC. 2023, U.S., DCP, 100 minutes. Recommended for 17+.



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UNDER THE SOUTHERN CROSS: THE ART AND LEGACY OF HENRY FAULKNER

There's been much said about Henry Faulkner's life as a colorful local character, artist and lifelong friend of Tennessee Williams, yet, are we appreciating Faulkner for what is most important? With recent research, we're finding that Faulkner may be a much more important figure in the larger gay historical narrative. Under the Southern Cross finds Henry's place in this narrative.

An unflinching and loving look at painter and poet Henry L. Faulkner, considered by many as the most documented queer man in the history of Kentucky, this film brings into view a range of conversations about American culture, history and rebellion against the dominant narrative about what is normal, natural and beautiful in our sexuality and identity. At the same time, the film explores the life and work of a brilliant artist who was an intimate friend of Edward Melcarth, Tennessee Williams, and Jamie Herlihy.

Produced for the recently opened Liberation Pavilion in the National Museum of WWII, New Orleans and set in a space that evokes the annex where Anne Frank hid from Nazi captors for two years, the story is told through the "voice" of Anne Frank, enveloping sound design and impressionistic imagery that suggest the conditions in the outside world that forced Anne Frank and her family into hiding. 7 minutes.

Follows recording artist Michael McArthur on the final 24 hours of tour as he returns for an intimate show in his hometown. With McArthur as a vessel, viewers are invited to reflect on their own connection to home. He navigates the local landscape, delving into hoarders' trash, scouring dumpsters, and exploring flea markets to unearth materials that assemble into a room-sized, interactive installation. 25 minutes.

Unfortunately, her satisfaction disappoints everyone around her. Her boss can't fathom why she won't take a promotion, her lack of ambition dissuades potential love interests, and her parents push her to sell her estate since she has no interest in

starting a family. These pressures leave Misha isolated and sick of justifying her choices.

When an earnest 19-year-old mistakes Misha for a fellow student, she finds solace in his lack of expectation and begins a relationship with him.
